Update on the StEP

Roz Johnson has been appointed as the Volunteer Manager for the Steps to Employment Project and will be overseeing the Project and it's strategic development from November 1st. There will be 2 new volunteer team members joining her in January and details of these will be available on the job section of the ECHO website soon. One vacancy is for a Volunteer Coordinator and the other is for an Outreach Officer. Exciting times are ahead.

Lots has been going on behind the scenes to roll out the new volunteer Project.

Paperwork has been updated, as have the volunteer training and induction packs. The budget has been allocated, to include volunteer social events.

Roz has also been very busy building new partnerships with organisations ready for supported volunteers, participants and people in the community to become StEP beneficiaries and undertake work experience and volunteering opportunities outside of ECHO. This is with a view to gaining skills and experience to then apply for jobs in the paid workforce. These beneficiaries will be supported by the Outreach Officer who will also run workshops around areas important for applying for work. We already have one StEP beneficiary starting work experience with Brightwells Auctioneers in November, and Roz spent a VERY muddy but fab day at The Cart Shed making a pot holder out of willow around a fire in the woods and recruiting more beneficiaries and volunteers.

If you are interested in becoming a Steps to Employment beneficiary then please contact Roz. She is also looking for volunteers who would like to work alongside the Outreach Officer as a StEP volunteer, to accompany the Outreach Officer and StEP beneficiaries to their placements in the community.

We currently have vacancies for volunteers in the ECHO shop. We would like to put together a team of afternoon volunteers—1pm to 3pm so that we can open all day. This would be on a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. We would also like to open on a Wednesday, at least in the morning. And of course, Studio Mirai, Clever Betsy, The Priory Centre, LifeLinks, Social and Leisure and Eaton Barn are always happy to welcome new volunteers.
