



Rep Group Update

We met with John Campion, the West Mercia police and crime commissioner to tell him about our experiences with the police and what we think the police can do better to support adults with disabilities. We told him we want better lighting and more public transport later at night to help keep us safe. We want to see more police officers out and about in our community.

We also want better ways to report things to the police and have them give us more time and support when we do go to them.

There are things that we can do right now to stay safe and get help when we need it. Herefordshire Mencap have a safe places scheme. You can have a free 'I need help card' and put your name and emergency contact details on it and keep it in your bag. This way, if you ever need help, all you have to do is show this card and the person helping you knows who to contact. There are also shops and businesses in Herefordshire that have had training so that you can go to them and ask for help and they will know what the card means. They should have a yellow sticker in their window that looks like this.



If you would like a card, please let Claire Mee in the office know and she will give you a card.
