
Participants have been inspired to act out their favourite songs, Storytelling is the Midweek Party!

### Worcester Tribute Festival on 23rd August



#### A spotlight on being a Priory Centre Volunteer

The Volunteer Voice interviewed Hanna, a volunteer at Studio Mirai and The Priory Centre to find out about her experiences of working with the participants and staff team at The Priory Centre. She said: "For a year and a half I have been a volunteer at the Priory project on Fridays. It's really a lot of fun. I love spending time with the participants. It sounds like a cliche but it really is very humbling as they teach me a lot about life.

Friday's participants have more complex needs and are non verbal. They respond positively to all that is offered to them. That doesn't happen by chance, but due to the amazing commitment and creativity of the project manager Tracy, and her incredible staff. She has nurtured such a skilled team which is a pleasure to be part of.

The staff give their whole hearts to caring for the participants. They encourage, build confidence, become childlike but never patronising in order to connect, to play, and develop a wonderful creative energy. There is much joy in being part of a wholly positive and really loving environment".





"A typical Friday involves lots", Hannah continues, "from chair exercises or the parachute game, maybe there's bingo or cards. Then a break for tea, coffee and cake! We usually have an amble 'round town. Afterwards it's back for lunch which always feels like sharing a family meal round the table chatting and laughing. Eating together feels really nurturing. Then we might do some more crafts. The whole place is full of beautiful things the participants have made! And it's forever changing! The ideas the staff come up with are just fantastic.

Sometimes we relax watching a movie the guys have chosen. It's such a joy hearing the guys laugh at the funny antics in a film. The Priory Project is a real blessing to so many of our participants. I try to go most Fridays and I am the richer for it".






#### Rachel at the Body Clinic

The Body Clinic is on West Street in Leominster, They offer treatments for five areas of holistic health care; social, emotional, physical, spiritual and mental. Two weeks ago, they welcomed Rachel as a voluntary member of their team. They posted the following on their Facebook page. "Rachel has joined our reception team for a period of work experience. This placement has been facilitated through partnership with ECHO's Steps to Employment Project (StEP), which focuses on creating an inclusive work environment where individuals with varying abilities can find meaningful opportunities to contribute and grow professionally."

Rachel is very lucky in that in order to explain the treatments to customers, she will be experiencing some of them herself, starting with a massage!

She said, 'I am really enjoying working in a different environment. Learning about all the therapies is a real eye opener. Michelle helped me get settled in on my first day and I feel confident I will have plenty of help from Leanne who is the receptionist'.
